Instructions for Application:

Statewide Journeyman licenses are issued by examination. Persons applying for statewide Journeyman examination must document (work affidavits) a minimum of 8,000 hours of experience that shows you have the necessary qualifications, training, and technical knowledge to install electrical wiring, apparatus or equipment, light, heat, or power. An applicant for a statewide Journeyman Electrician examination may substitute one year of education in an approved electrical curriculum or apprenticeship program for one thousand hours of electrical experience for a maximum of two thousand hours of the eight thousand hours total required. The applicant must provide appropriate documentation, subject to the approval of the Board, of said education or apprenticeship program.

Once the application has been approved, you will be notified within 10 business days to submit an exam fee of \$115.00 (Cashier's Check or Money Order only). Examination information and how to get study reference materials are in the **Candidate Information Bulletin** located under the forms section of the Board's website <a href="https://www.aecb.alabama.gov">www.aecb.alabama.gov</a> . Make the fee payable to the AL Electrical Contractors Board.
